

From 22nd to 25th June, more than 1200 winegrowers and merchants representing 80 Bordeaux and Nouvelle-Aquitaine appellations will be present and happy to share their knowledge about the production of wine while visitors taste.

To ensure the survival of the wine sector, Bordeaux's vineyards are making commitments and modifying their practices. Today, 75% of the region's vineyards earn certification for their environmental approach.

From 22nd June, the Garonne quayside will be transformed into an "appellation village": a promenade for tasting, meeting people and relaxing.

Its 8 pavilions offer a wide range of flavours and savoir-faire. Meet passionate and committed winemakers and dive into the world of Bordeaux wines!

01 BORDEAUX CHILLED WINES

This stand proposes a wide selection of chilled wines with a colour chart that goes from a translucent pale yellow to a golden copper-tinted yellow, also featuring the light or intense pinks of Bordeaux's rosé wines. 21 AOCs are represented by the people responsible for making these dry whites, sweet whites, rosés, clairets, and sparkling wines with ardour and precision. These wines are perfect for an aperitif, a meal and even a dessert.

BORDEAUX AND BORDEAUX SUPÉRIEUR REDS

The Bordeaux and Bordeaux Supérieur red wine appellations are the only ones found across all of the Gironde wine regions. Spread over 45,000 hectares, these appellations are enriched by a multitude of different soils and characteristics that create an infinite diversity: each wine has its own style and character.

03 MOUTON CADET -BARON PHILIPPE DE ROTHSCHILD

In 1930, driven by a desire to show wine lovers across the world all of the richness found in Bordeaux's terroir, Baron Philippe de Rothschild created Mouton Cadet. Nine decades and three generations later, Mouton Cadet continues to innovate in particular by offering many wines certified in organic farming. Their ambition is to guarantee the best quality, from the ground to the glass, while preserving Nature and Humanity - from the winegrower to the consumer.

04 GRAVES - SAUTERNES

The appellations of Graves, Pessac-Léognan, Sauternes and Barsac were created on the part of the left bank that was the cradle of the Bordeaux vineyards. They are home to a wide range of red, dry whites and sweet whites, including some Graves Crus Classés and 1855 Grands Crus Classés. All of these wines are shaped by families of winemakers that are both authentic and audacious, reflecting the personality of their terroir.

05 SAINT-ÉMILION - POMEROL- FRONSAC

This stand is home to wines from the ten appellations in the Saint-Émilion - Pomerol - Fronsac area. Combining finesse and intensity, elegance and power, these wines convey the personality of their renowned terroir. Maintaining ancestral traditions while constantly innovating, they are produced using new methods with respect for the environment and welfare.

06 THE HILLSIDES

Located on the right bank of the Gironde and the Garonne, the seven Côtes de Bordeaux appellations are home to audacious winemakers and family estates. Their know-how, passed down from generation to generation, fuses with the natural elements of the region such as the hills to create gourmet, elegant wines.

07 MÉDOC WINES

The vineyards of the Médoc are singular for their size, economic power, variety, but also for the coexistence of tradition and cutting-edge technology, as well as their prestigious names. The Médoc produces red wines with very different characteristics, determined by the grape varieties used, the soil, the methods of production and the winemaker's style.

08 NOUVELLE-AQUITAINE WINES

Vineyards extend beyond the borders of Bordeaux. Indeed, the Nouvelle-Aquitaine region contains many other famous appellations and protected geographical indications: Côtes du Marmandais, IGP Atlantique, Vins de Bergerac, Côtes de Duras, Jurançon, and more. This stand takes you on a sensorial voyage across the region via white, red and rosé wines.

THE WINE TRADE ACCORDING TO WINE MERCHANTS





The Bordeaux Wine Festival also brings you food flavours from the region in the festival villages. The range of options available has been made possible thanks to L'Agence de l'Alimentation Nouvelle-Aquitaine (the AANA). Festival-goers will be able to taste all of the culinary treasures of the region in three different ways, with something for everyone. With a range of tasty options, visitors will be spoiled for choice!

Food stands

As the primary ambassadors of regional gastronomy, the producers, artisans and restaurateurs put all their heart and expertise into serving good products that are both healthy and sustainable. Be it sweet or savoury, the festival caters for everyone's tastes. You might start, for example, with oysters from the Arcachon Bay-based oyster farmer Marc Druart, followed by salted meat and charcuterie from the Aldudes Valley (Pierre Oteiza), before tasting cheese from Guyenne and Gascogne (Marayn de Bartassac).

Those looking for meat will find duck from Ferme de Hournadet and Ferme de Lou Vincent, as well as Limousine beef from Ferme du Roseix. Other possibilities include: Canard Street, where they serve duck in all its forms; Suzette Crêpereie Urbaine, where they revisit the buckwheat galette; and Smoky Rub, serving smoked meat and vegetables.

Vegetarians will have plenty to choose from too! Each stand is to serve at least one vegetarian option, while others, such as the greengrocers Petit Marché d'Ornano, have a strong focus on vegetables.

For dessert, there is no lack of options: ice cream from Landes-based Lacroix or Gironde-based Sofia, strawberries and sorbets from Corrèze (Ferme des Parettes) and canelés from La Toque Cuivrée!

For those looking to take a little time to relax before going back to tasting wine, stop off at the Dordogne, Corrèze and Lot-et-Garonne stands, or the Basque Country stand, where you'll find La Maison Basque de Bordeaux.

Food trucks

These pillars of street food culture allow you to eat on the go. Once again, this year, you'll see classic dishes on their menus: burgers, fish and chips, sandwiches, and more. Get a taste of Arcachon Bay at Chai Thonthon, where you'll find fish burgers and fish and chips.

Stop at Green Garage for some veggie rolls or pulled pork. Le Limousine Truck serves veal, pork and truffade: a potato and cheese dish from Limousin. Why not finish with a Liège waffle?





Using their expertise, they create choreography using light to tell stories in the sky. This specially created show is sure to amaze kids and adults alike.





Step on board a sailing ship



Do you know how to erecognise a tall ship?

A tall ship is a monohull boat with a hull that measures at least 30 feet (9.14 metres) in length. Their Class is determined by two criteria: their size and their rigging. As such, all ships with a hull that is more than 40 m long or with fully rigged ones are A Class ships.

These three ships are accessible with a ticket (one for each ship). The crew will welcome you on board and, depending on their availability, answer your questions. On the international boats, exchanges will be mostly in English. Those who wish to may take a French booklet at the beginning of the visit.

LE BELEM

A CLASS - THREE-MASTED BARQUE - OVERALL LENGTH: 58 M

Built in 1896, Belem is undoubtedly one of the most famous French ships! Its history is full of adventures, nationality changes and different purposes, but above all, it is the last French commercial sailing ship from the 19th century still sailing today. It became a listed historical monument in 1984.

GALEÓN ANDALUCÍA

A CLASS - 6 SQUARE SAILS AND ONE LATEEN - 38 M

This grand replica of a 17th-century Spanish galleon was built by the Nao Victoria foundation and is the only one of its kind in the world. El Galéon is an embodiment of tradition and modernity, reflecting Spanish culture. Indeed, for three centuries, galleons of this kind sailed between Spain, Asia and the Americas, fostering trade and dialogue.

SANTA MARIA MANUELA

A CLASS - FOUR-MASTED SCHOONER - 68 M

Santa Maria Manuela was launched in 1937 in Lisbon (Portugal). Between 1937 and 1993, she transported thousands of sailors to Newfoundland and Greenland to catch cod, the most popular fish among the Portuguese. Today, she has a new role, taking guests on oceanic adventures and scientific expeditions.



Accessibility

Pushchairs are not allowed onboard. Due to the narrowness of the gangway, disabled access cannot be guaranteed. Persons requiring crutches will be allowed access according to instructions given by the captain of the ship. At low tide, the gradient of the pontoons can reach 15%. The presence of someone to assist is recommended.

More boats on the quays

THE PEN DUICKS

The Pen Duicks come from a line of legendary boats belonging to Eric Tabarly. Their name means "little black beast" in Breton, referring to the black-capped chickadee. They can be seen at Bordeaux Fête le Vin.

Tabarly, un homme des bâteaux Maison Écocitoyenne

Directed by Dominique Pipat and Laurent Cadoret, this 30-minute film will be followed by a talk with a skipper and Jean-Pierre Couteleau, the president of the Eric Tabarly association.

The director claims that, "thanks to [Eric Tabarly], I have sailed all of the oceans of the world". The documentary paints a portrait using personal accounts that tell the story of this maverick sailor who became a legend.

- An event aligned with the city's commitments

In March 2022, Bordeaux Métropole and its Reducing and repurposing waste Tourist Office published their tourism and events strategy until 2026. One of the key strategic issues addressed by this roadmap was how to make Bordeaux a venue for events that have a positive impact on the city, with gatherings that have a minimised environmental footprint and significant social and societal benefits. To this end, Bordeaux Fête le Vin upholds this region-wide commitment to hosting events responsibly.

An environmentally responsible event

The 2023 edition of Bordeaux Fête le Vin has ISO 20121 certification. But what does that mean? The ISO 20121 label is awarded to events that have chosen to take a sustainable approach to organisation. Such is the case for Bordeaux Fête le Vin, which continues to amplify its commitments to protect the environment.

In order to not only reduce waste but also to repurpose waste generated at the event, Bordeaux Fête le Vin has adopted certain concrete actions:

- Containers, cutlery, cups and serviettes provided at all stands at Bordeaux Fête le Vin will be entirely compostable;
- An objective of zero plastic on sale is in place;
- The size of containers for dishes served at food stands will be reduced significantly and adapted to their products;
- A "Green Brigade" will be deployed to make the public aware of the importance and aid them in the process of sorting waste;
- · Glass bottles and corks will be collected and subsequently treated;
- Organic waste will be repurposed by Les Détritivores, cigarette butts by Eco-mégot and oyster shells by Coquille;
- Those working at the stands and festival-goers are invited to bring their own water containers to avoid the use of plastic bottles. Water fountains with drinking water will be made available throughout the site.
- In partnership with the association Ceseau, pocket ashtrays will be distributed freely to visitors at the festival's information points (while stocks last).

Reusing equipment

Most of the equipment needed to put on Bordeaux Fête le Vin will be reused or given to associations once the festival is over thanks to our partners Assistant à Maîtrise d'Ouvrage, Côte Ouest.

Spreading awareness

Throughout the 2023 edition of Bordeaux Fête le Vin, an exhibition will be dedicated to the environmental issues faced by the world of wine, how the industry is reacting, and the festival's environmental initiatives.

A responsible economy

The aforementioned environmental issues are also dependent on the economy. For this year's edition, Bordeaux Fête le Vin is promoting local producers, local and seasonal produce and highlighting local savoir-faire.

The appellation villages and all of our partners' spaces are compliant with disabled access regulations.

- Ticket booths adapted for persons with reduced mobility

As an inclusive festival, Bordeaux Fête le Vin has chosen to use genderless toilets.

The Angela campaign

Bordeaux Fête le Vin is a partner of the Angela campaign. The question "Where is Angela?" can be asked to staff in bars and nightclubs, partner businesses and events in the public space if one is in need of help. The staff react by ensuring that the person feels safe when confronted with an uncomfortable situation or harassment - whatever their age, gender or condition, day or night.

Recruitment

When recruiting ticket officers and customer service assistants for Bordeaux Fête le Vin, the organisation works with the Bordeaux Maison de l'Emploi, who work to achieve social insertion, helping people overcome barriers to employment.

Promoting moderate and responsible consumption

Bordeaux Fête le Vin is primarily a tasting festival, as such it assumes the responsibility of promoting responsible drinking. A prevention space will be on site, where APIPAF 33 will make visitors aware of the risks of excessive drinking, in addition to handing out free breathalyser tests and demonstrating the dangers of alcohol. Alcohol abuse is dangerous for your health, drink in moderation.

Analysing visitors' experiences

Bordeaux Tourisme et Congrès will be making a questionnaire available to Bordeaux Fête le Vin participants in order to evaluate the quality of their experience and tourism products on offer, with an aim of improving future editions of Bordeaux Fête le Vin. At the end of the edition, a study on the festival's carbon emissions will be carried out to measure the 2023 edition's environmental impact and comparisons will be made with previous editions. The conclusions drawn will be used to improve future editions.

and certified winegrowing in an environmental approach. Like the Bordeaux vineyard as a whole, each pavilion of the appellations is committed to meeting environmental, social and economic challenges.

In 2022, more than 75% of the Bordeaux vinevard area has a certified environmental approach (vs. 35% in 2014). Bordeaux brings together a diverse range of properties and production and protection methods. Within this great diversity, the best-known environmental labels exist side by side. Some properties have multiple certifications.

For instance, 23% of the Bordeaux vineyard area is farmed organically and 50,000 hectares (approx.) are certified HVE (High Environmental Value) or nearly 50% of the vineyard area.

The climate is a major parameter for wine quality. It has an impact on the terroir, the vintage effect and the size of the harvest. Until now, the change in the climate has had guite a positive effect on the ripening of Bordeaux grape crop sprays... varieties. However, uncertainties over the changes still to come have led the vineyard to anticipate and adapt.

The Bordeaux Wine Festival promotes organic How? Adapting for example the grape varieties with new varieties authorized in the production of Bordeaux AOCs, with respect for the typical character of the wines. Adapting through new practices like rethinking plot location to reduce exposure to the sun, delaying pruning, using grass cover...Reducing the Bordeaux wines carbon footprint (-39% between 2007 and 2022, target - 54% by 2030).

The 4 pillars of this approach:



- Preservation of biodiversity
- Maintaining social cohesion
- Anticipating climate change
- Towards corporate social responsibility (CSR)

For more than 20 years, the Bordeaux vineyard One of the pillars of Bordeaux's major lines of work is research. In Gironde, more than 20 public ment. Bordeaux has already come a long way in laboratories and 200 researchers combine their efforts in the service of viticultural knowledge. This unique advantage combined with a real partnership with the Bordeaux wine industry for more than 20 years has enabled concrete progress in the field. Each year, 1.2 million euros is devoted by the Interprofession to this work, including 400,000 euros specifically invested in research on the reduction of pesticides.
